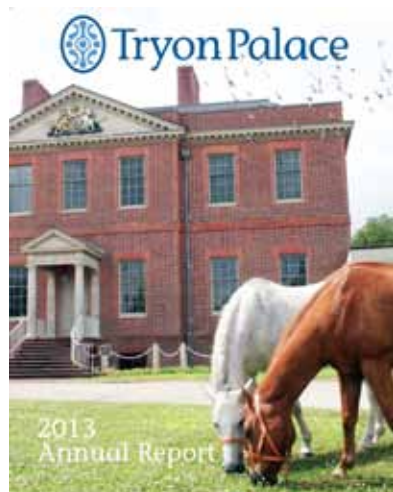

Tryon Palace, located in New Bern, NC, is part of the Office of Archives and History, an agency of the North Carolina Department of Cultural Resources. Tryon Palace is one of North Carolina's most significant historic sites. It is the home of the Governor's Palace, North Carolina's first colonial and first state capitol, and includes historic buildings, gardens and the North Carolina History Center, which revolutionizes the visitor experience through use of the latest interactive technology. The History Center includes galleries, a performance hall, the museum store and a waterfront café.

Tryon Palace's mission is to engage present and future generations in the history of North Carolina from early settlement in 1710, the development of statehood, and into the mid-20th century. It is dedicated to collecting, interpreting and preserving objects, buildings, landscapes and events that enrich the understanding of the making of our state and nation.

From the Foundation

Over the last 55 years, Tryon Palace has played a fundamental role in preserving and teaching the history of our state and nation. A participatory democracy depends on engaged and informed citizens. A knowledge of great challenges and great leadership in the past is essential as we make decisions for the future. The teaching and learning of our history is not dispensable. It is a patriotic duty and, at our peril we neglect it.

What lessons are taught by a knowledge of the perseverance of our early settlers through hardships? What courage is learned from the participants in the First Provincial Congress held in defiance of British orders in August of 1774? What wisdom is shown in the Bayard versus Singleton decision establishing the national precedent of judicial review just after the Revolution and actualizing the separation of powers? What reverence for justice is imparted by knowing the actions of Judge William Gaston in his fight for religious tolerance and the rights of blacks, both free and enslaved?

Through the remarkable lives of fugitive slaves like Abraham Galloway, who fought for and achieved their own freedom, we learn how cherished that freedom must be. Through the lives of women like Bayard Wooten, we see that greatness is achieved by an adherence to the highest standards.

These stories tell us who we are and who we can be. These stories are the ones we tell. They are not abstractions. They are as real and present as we choose to make them.

For all these years, a most remarkable public/private partnership has made it possible to tell these stories. Today, as perhaps never before in the history of this site, we have challenges to accomplishing our mission. Challenges bring us choices. Just as great leaders in the past responded to challenge, giving us so much, the challenges and the choices are now ours. It is our watch. Those challenges are also opportunities to lead.

One of my dear friends in New Bern is a man named Luke P. Martin, Jr. Mr. Martin is the son (literally the son) of a man who fought in the Civil War. His father, born enslaved on a plantation near Plymouth, North Carolina, made his way as a fugitive through rivers and swamps to New Bern in January of 1863, just after the Emancipation Proclamation. Reaching Union-occupied New Bern meant freedom. Once here, Martin joined the recruits for the Colored Troops (35th USCT), and was wounded in Florida as he fought to achieve freedom for others. His youngest son, Luke, was born into freedom, but grew up through the worst of Jim Crow. This son, Luke, grew up to become a master brick mason, contributing greatly to the restoration and reconstruction of Tryon Palace. His work is legendary. At age 97, he still works today, though he told me that he no longer does “heavy work.” I once asked Mr. Martin, a man who came through some of the worst Jim Crow days, how bad it was. His answer was quick. “I had a lot of hard days,” he said, “but, I never had a bad day.”

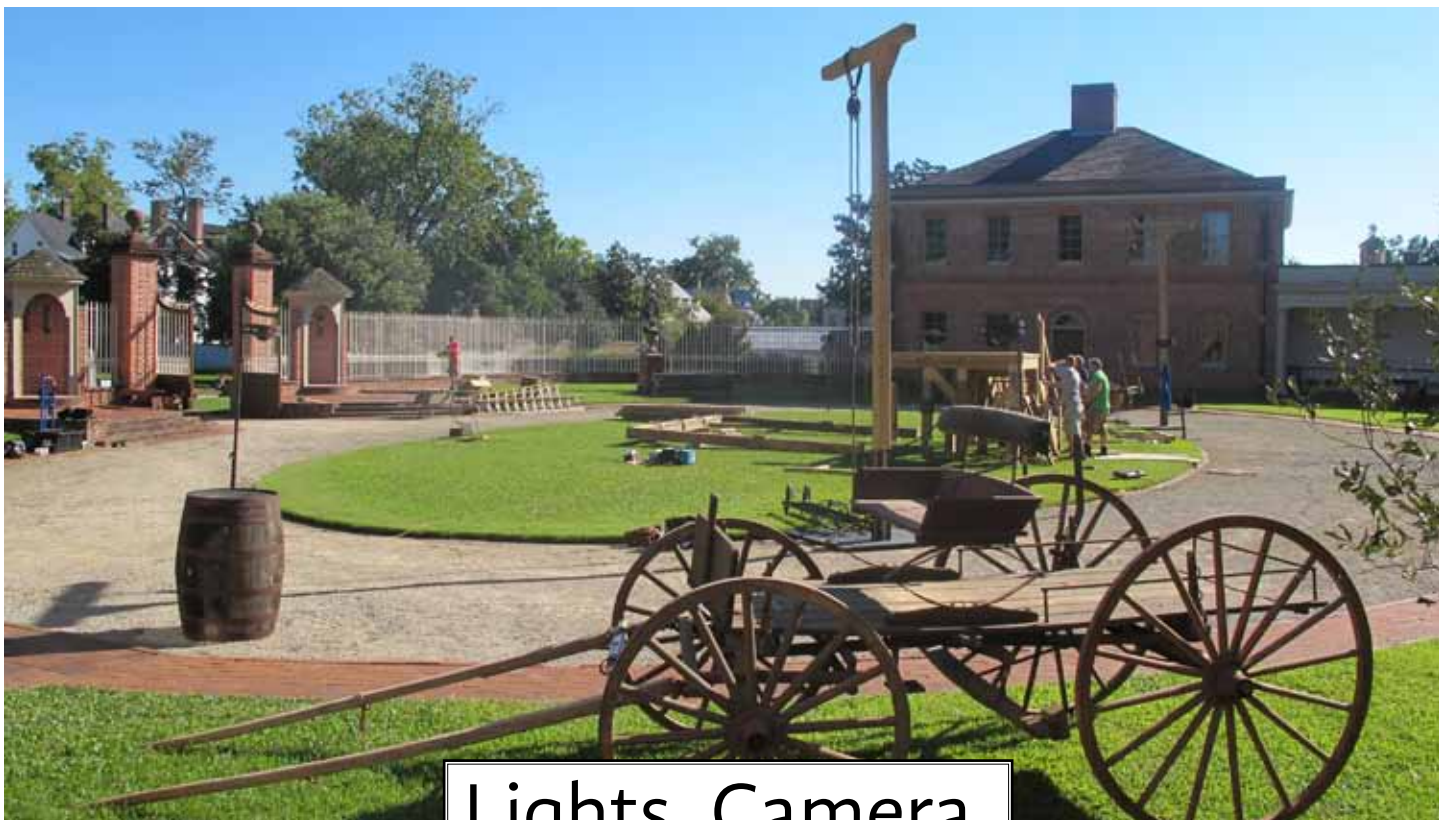
Every school child in North Carolina should hear Mr. Martin’s words (and we’re working on that project). We, also, need to hear his words and heed them.

If we are to turn our challenges into opportunities, we will have hard days. Yet, there is no reason for us to have a bad day. The role of the Tryon Palace Foundation is both essential and existential at this moment in the history of this site. It’s all hands on deck and we need more hands.

Thank you for all that you have done and will do. Loving our story, and telling our story as truthfully and inclusively as we can, is possible only because people like you are willing to devote your time and resources to the opportunities.

Lights, Camera, **ACTION!**

Tryon Palace made its Hollywood debut in 2013 when FOX's new TV series "Sleepy Hollow" used the site as a backdrop for several scenes set in colonial America. Filming took place in July and September, and included scenes in front of the Governor's Palace and Daves House, as well as interiors in the Stanly House and the Stable Office. "Sleepy Hollow" brought great exposure to Tryon Palace—the series' first episode aired as the highest-rated drama to premiere on FOX's fall lineup in seven years. The network has signed the series for a second season, and the Palace is hopeful that producers will return to film more scenes in 2014.



The Year in Review

For Tryon Palace, 2013 was a year filled with innovative solutions and seized opportunities. Each of these new endeavors helped preserve the viability and integrity of Tryon Palace's educational mission, as well as produce new revenue streams and increase attendance.

Growth

One area that continues to show Tryon Palace's greatest potential for revenue growth is the use of venue rental space for weddings and special events. In 2013, Tryon Palace used the North Carolina History Center to create new partnerships with local not-for-profit groups, such as the Craven Arts Council and Gallery, and the N.C. Cooperative Extension, that bring an array of choices, entertainment, and new audiences to the Palace. Of course, one of Tryon Palace's most well-known clients isn't a local nonprofit; it's the largest food and beverage company in North America.

"Earlier in the year, after PepsiCo announced they would schedule their annual Board of Directors and Shareholders meeting at the North Carolina History Center for several years to come, we knew we were witnessing history in the making," said Philippe Lafargue, executive director for Tryon Palace. "This has been a fantastic relationship that only gets better with time, and we are most thankful to PepsiCo for their support, and for recognizing what a truly wonderful facility we have."

Tryon Palace also experienced growth with its annual Christmas Candlelight celebration. Offering online ticketing for the first time in the organization's history, this year's Candlelight brought visitors from 15 different states. This resulted in the Palace notching its highest attendance on record for a single night of Candlelight, and the highest total attendance (both weekends combined) since 2008. Understanding that special events are one of the most important ways to grow new and repeat visitation, Tryon Palace introduced pilot programs such as Jane Austen in June, tours of the Conservation Lab, and Historic Dinners in the Kitchen Office (both dinners sold out in less than two days).

The Palace also gained media exposure with help from the FOX TV series "Sleepy Hollow." The series was filmed at the Palace on two separate occasions, which attracted visitors, school groups, and passersby—all hoping to see a glimpse of Hollywood on the historic site.

Visitor Attendance



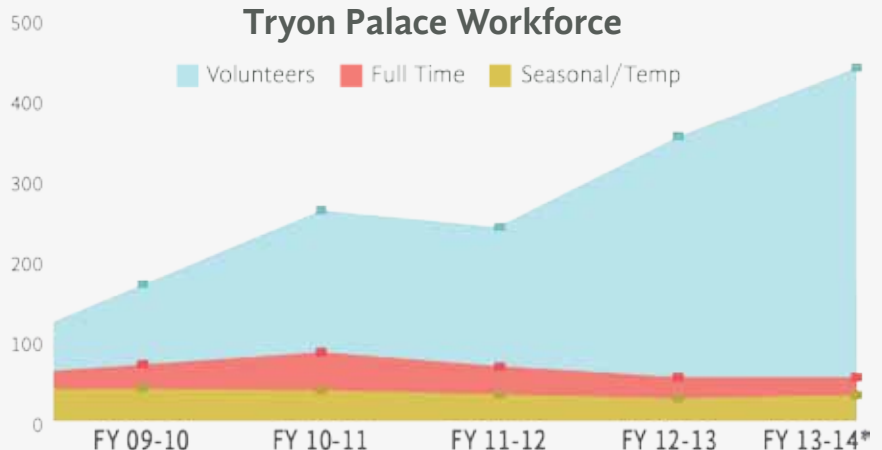
Denotes total visitation at Tryon Palace by calendar year.

Challenges

The State of North Carolina's biennial budget for Tryon Palace (FY13-15) was a mix of good and bad news; a one-time appropriation of \$500,000 was certified in the budget to help maintain funding levels for FY13-14, but if nothing changes by July 2014, the Palace will experience a \$400,000 loss in funding for FY14-15. If implemented, this cut would translate into the loss of approximately 10 full-time positions at the Palace, and introduce the possibility of reducing operating hours to only weekends—in short, it would be a devastating blow to the Palace's day-to-day operations.

One of the ways Tryon Palace has worked to close the gap in funding has been through the efforts of its primary fundraising arm, the Tryon Palace Foundation. Formerly known as the Tryon Palace Council of Friends, the Foundation underwent several structural changes in 2013, which included an increase to the minimum donation needed to receive the group's most popular benefit (free admission for a year). Many of the Friends' longtime supporters did not welcome this change, and by January 2014 the benefit levels had been restructured to better reflect the needs and requests of the Foundation's members. The Foundation welcomed input from its members; however, some extra effort will be needed throughout 2014 to assure members that the benefit structure has reverted back to a more affordable model that includes the benefit of free admission.

Looking Ahead

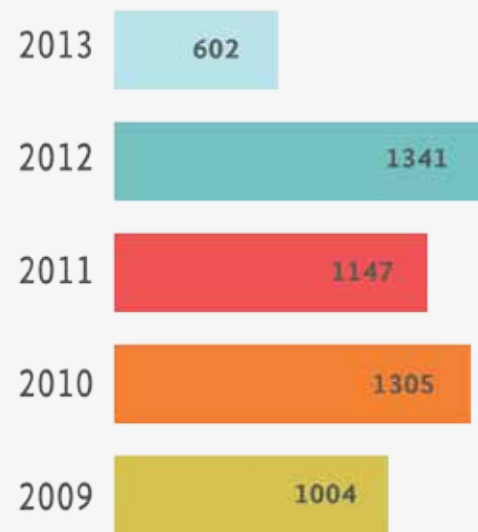
Attendance is one of the greatest indicators of Tryon Palace's success, and in 2013 the Palace saw a 5-percent increase over the previous year. An even greater gauge for growth is that attendance from July through December of 2013 was 12 percent higher than the same period in 2012.

"I believe this is the result of a concentrated effort to reach out to other organizations and to expand our audience," said Lafargue "We are providing different and unexpected programs, blending history and the arts, and implementing very focused and effective marketing efforts. I am confident this is the start of many good things to come."

Positive growth continued in January 2014 as ticketed attendance saw a 67-percent jump over the previous year, due in part to a traveling Blackbeard exhibit in the North Carolina History Center. Additionally, the Foundation's flagship fundraising event, WinterFeast (formerly known as the Aw Shucks! Oyster Roast), achieved record attendance and sold out of tickets more than two weeks before the event took place. Tryon Palace continues to work toward creating an exhibit schedule and special events that will help these attendance trends continue through 2015.

Each effort to increase attendance and create new revenue streams is in place to support the Palace's educational mission, as well as meet the challenge of creating a 50/50 share of funding between the State and private donors. Tryon Palace has moved the needle on that goal in recent years, closing out fiscal year 2012-2013 with 52.9 percent of its funding coming from State appropriations, and the rest from earned revenue and private supporters. This is an encouraging and healthy trend, and one that must continue as Tryon Palace plans for 2015 and beyond.

Volunteers Donate 24,892 Hours of Service



Most people don't realize the full impact that volunteers have on the daily operations of Tryon Palace. Volunteers can be found helping with maintenance issues, upkeep in the gardens, accounting and administration, driving the shuttle, helping with crafts, serving as guides, assisting in the Museum Store, or working as summer interns. In short, Tryon Palace would not be able to function without the support it receives from its volunteers.

In 2013, that level of support grew to 440 people, a 24-percent increase over the previous year. All combined, these dedicated volunteers contributed 24,892 hours to Tryon Palace, which equates to a labor cost value of \$545,352.

"Every opportunity I have, everywhere I go, I brag about their commitment and service in the many areas of Tryon Palace," said Philippe Lafargue, executive director for Tryon Palace. "We have blown by our past target of reaching the half-million-dollar benchmark in terms of volunteer labor value and we look forward and envision the year we reach the one-million-dollar mark."

In addition to all the areas that were supported in 2013 through volunteer hours, Tryon Palace was also pleased to receive assistance for the second year in a row from the Autism Society of North Carolina, which brings young men to clean windows at the North Carolina History Center.

Overall, the amount of volunteer hours in 2013 did not see an increase over 2012's 24,978 hours, but the 24-percent growth in participants—from 355 in 2012 to 440 in 2013—is certainly a strong indicator for more potential growth in the future.

"There is no doubt, that if we did not have our volunteers, we would not be able to deliver the programs and education that we currently provide," said Lafargue.

The brick foundation used to support Governor William Tryon's palace was unearthed during an archaeological dig in the early 1950s.
